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
The Valley of Fire State Park, Nevada, USA

Just outside of Las Vegas, where the glittering lights of the casinos fade away, lies an area that has captivated and inspired humans for more than 4,000 years. The Valley of Fire rises from the sand of the Nevada landscape, cutting a path through the gray and tan limestone, revealing over 30,000 acres of brilliant red Aztec sandstone.

Carved by the warm, sweeping winds of the Moapa Valley desert over the course of 150-million years, from the Jurassic Age of the dinosaurs, the Valley of Fire offers visitors the chance to see rock formations that play tricks on the eyes as they seemingly change color and shape as the sun shifts overhead. Petrified logs and stumps, can be found in locations within the valley, some dating back to 225-million years ago, before the valley was even formed.

Ancient Native American tribes, the Ancestral Puebloans or Anasazi, roamed the lands leaving behind ancient petroglyphs dating back over 2,000 years. The lack of consistent rain or water in the area, the valley only receives 4-inches of rain each year, prevented them from settling the area. While we don't know what exactly they were trying to tell us with their pictures of the wild beasts and timeworn riverbeds, we do know that the Valley of Fire continues to motivate those who love the outdoors and adventurers at heart.

Modern trails offer an opportunity to walk along many of the same paths that Native Americans used for gathering food, hunting animals, and religious ceremonies. Popular trails include quick hikes to the White Domes and popular Instagramworthy locations like Arch Rock, the Beehives or Elephant Rock.

The Valley of Fire State Park was formed in 1935 and remains Nevada's largest state park. It offers modern amenities for picnics, overnight camping and public events for the hundreds of thousands of visitors it receives each year from all across the United States and around the world. Despite the modern feel the park remains home to bighorn sheep, badgers, rattlesnakes, ring-tailed cats, and desert tortoises.

The park remains popular with Hollywood as well. Viva Las Vegas starring Elvis
Presley filmed racing scenes there in 1963.
A few years later Bur Lancaster's film The
Professionals set up locations in the valley
as well. Total Recall, starring Arnold
Schwarzenegger, filmed the majority of its
Mars scenes in the Valley of Fire. Star Trek
fans will recognize the Silica Dome as the
place where Captain James T. Kirk was
buried in the films.

The Valley of Fire is a stark contrast to the gambling and parties of the Las Vegas Strip, but it offers something that the casinos never could: a win each time you visit.






PRAGUE



Charles Bridge

Jewish Synagogue


Synagogue also called the Altneuschul is Europe's oldest active synagogue. Its Prague's first gothic style building.

The currency in Prague is the Czech Crown (CZK).






Famous Street Food

HOW TO REACH

By Air

The city is well connected by Air and Railway from the important European cities. It is also well connected to other international destinations like USA, Canada and Middle East as there are direct flights run through these destinations.

From airport you can take bus 119 to Divoka Sarka and from there take tram no 20 to Malostranske namesti near Charles bridge and city center.

By Train

The main train station is Praha Hlavní Nádraží. It is located in the city center, 5 minutes' walk from Wenceslas Square and 15 minutes from the Old Town Square. The second station is Nádraží Praha-Holešovice, situated just outside the center. From here you can travel into the center by tram, metro or taxi.

Do you know Indian citizens are now eligible for visa-free travel in Europe? Yes! You heard it right! The Government of the Republic of Serbia has announced visa exemption for Indian nationals holding ordinary passports. Henceforth, Indian nationals can visit the eastern European country without a visa. Indians can enter, transit through and stay in Serbia without a visa, for 30 days from the date of entry, within a period of one year.

Serbia is a non-EU and non-Schengen Country. Belgrade being the capital, is one of the least expensive capitals in Europe. It borders Hungary to the north, Romania to the northeast, Bulgaria to the southeast, North Macedonia to the south, Croatia and Bosnia and Herzegovina to the west, and Montenegro to the southwest. Serbia is attractive to tourists and safe for travel. Enjoy your days in Serbia!







State Hermitage Museum is the most prestigious and world's second largest museum after Louvre in Paris. It's the most popular attraction of St Petersburg, Russia and one of the must visit attractions for first time visitors in the city. Situated near the palace square, it's having more than 3 million items in its collection. The Hermitage museum collections occupy a large complex of six historic buildings. Of the six buildings in the main museum complex, five—namely the Winter Palace, Small Hermitage, Old Hermitage, New Hermitage, and Hermitage Theater—are open to the public

It opens at 10.30am to 6.00pm and it costs 600 rubles to visit this museum. From 9th July, 2020 museum started online tickets to enter the museum costing around 500 rubles. An electronic ticket will be valid for the chosen time slot and route only on one particular day. Here is our guide to explore this museum without any hassle.



Western European Art Collections

The Western European Art collection includes European paintings, sculpture, and applied arts. It is displayed, in about 120 rooms, on the first and second floor of the four main buildings. It is one of the world's finest collections, containing masterpieces from all the major centers of Europe from the 13th to the 20th centuries.

Egyptian Antiquities

Covering 31 halls, the Antiquities
Collection includes Assyrian,
Mesopotamian, and Egyptian artifacts, as
well as huge quantities of Greek and
Roman statuary. The most famous
attraction caught my eyes was Egyptian
mummy! Yes, it forms the part of
permanent display in Hall-100 of the
Winter Palace.

Prehistoric Arts

The prehistoric artifacts date from the Paleolithic to the Iron Age and were excavated all over Russia and other parts of the former Soviet Union and Russian Empire. Among them is a renowned collection of the art and culture of nomadic tribes of the Altai from Pazyryk and Bashadar sites, including the world's oldest surviving knotted-pile carpet and a well-preserved wooden chariot, both from the 4th–3rd centuries BC. It occupies two sections of the ground floor of the Winter Palace.

German, Swiss, British, French Fine Art

The first floor rooms on the southern facade of the Winter Palace are occupied by the collections of German fine art of the 16th century and French fine art of the 15th–18th centuries, including paintings by Poussin, Lorrain, and Watteau

Russian Art

The first floor of the Winter Palace on its eastern, northern and western sides are part of the Russian culture collection and host the exhibitions of Russian art from the 11th-19th centuries.

Mahabalipuram


Nahabalipuram also called Memallapuram is a histor port city in the Kancheepuram district of Tamil Nadu. It is a UNESCO world heritage site. The city was named by Narasimhavarman I of Pallava dynasty in 7th Century BCE. Pallavas are famous for the magnificent and excellent architecture. Mahabalipuram is one of the oldest cities in India and now its one of the major tourist attractions near Chennai. Mahabalipuram is famous for its serene beach, monoliths, stone carvings and cave temples.

Mahabalipuram is located around 56 kilometres from Chennai. The nearest airport to Mahabalipuram is at Chennai.

You can drive or hire a cab to reach Mahabalipuram from Chennai. You can also take the bus between Chennai and Mahabalipuram. The nearest railway station is Chengalapattu, which is around 30 km from Mahabalipuram.

Shore temple: The Shore Temple complex is located on Mahabalipuram beach. This is one of the surviving structure of the legendary Seven Pagodas. The temple was built between 700 and 728 CE. The temple complex is very near to the sea, and has three temples. Two temples are dedicated to Lord Shiva and one to Lord Vishnu. The temple is in Dravidian style.

Descent of Ganges (Arjuna's Penance):

Descent of Ganges or famously known as Arjuna's Penance, is a giant open-air carving carved on two monolithic rock boulders. The carving depicts the story of the descent of the sacred river Ganges to earth from the heavens led by Bhagiratha. The descent of the Ganges and Arjuna's Penance are portrayed in stone. This is one of the Group of Monuments at Mamallapuram that were designated as a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1984. The boulders measure 15 by 30 metres. Many of the figures of gods, people, half-humans and animals carved are in life size

Krishna Butter Ball: The boulder is approximately 6 meters high and 5 meters wide. This weighs around 250 tonnes.

It feels that the boulder is floating and barely stand on a slope on top of 1.2-meter (4 ft) high plinth which is a naturally eroded hill. It is said to have been at the same place for last 1200 years.


There are several other temples which are very beautifully carved. These temples are one of the finest testimonial to the ancient Hindu rock-cut cave architecture.

Mahabalipuram Lighthouse: Mahabalipuram Lighthouse was built and became fully functional on 1904. The lighthouse has been open to tourists since 2011. India's oldest lighthouse which was built around 640 AD by Pallava king Mahendra Pallava stands next to this modern structure. The Pallava era lighthouse is a protected monument and is maintained by the Archaeological Survey of India.



We started our journey by express train from Chennai to Agra with an intention of visiting Taj Mahal, and then to Manali

On the journey to the destination, we had awesome experience, and sweet memories which will last forever. It is obvious to people of south to have many misconception regarding people from north, because of conservative surrounding and limited knowledge of north. But when situations and events are prima facie, on each stop, each district, states, as we pass, we experienced the other side of the coin. The different cultured people, speaking different languages, made us to understand what the real diversity is?





ALONG THE MOUNTAIN VALLEY

A Muslim family joined us, up to Nagpur. I am very glad that they shared many of their views, problems, with us with open mind. We felt lonely when they got down at Nagpur.

When we were crossing the border of Madhya Pradesh and Rajasthan, on Chambal River bridge, we got an opportunity to get a flash back of 1970's Chambal valley Dacoits. The famous Dacoits like Phoolan Devi, Paan Singh Tomar, Maan Singh and Nirbhay Singh Gujjar are still household tales in these areas. But for many, they were the symbol of rebellion against the tyranny of the upper castes and elite against those who belong to lower castes.

Among these we can't forget Phoolan Devi', who has ruled Chambal nearly a decade, was surrendered and imprisoned in 1983. After her release in 1996, she was elected as M.P in 1999 and served Mirzapur till her assassination in 2001.

We reached Agra by 5 am and checked in to a hotel for freshening up. We checked out from the hotel by 7.0 am kept our luggage's in reception counter, and hurried to Taj Mahal. The glory and beauty of Taj Mahal on the bank of river Yamuna, made us to lose our self. With the help of our rickshaw wala, we could catch our train to Delhi as he brought our luggage's from the reception to station on time.

Upon arrival to old Delhi, we hired a rickshaw to the Majnu Ka Tilla, from there we had to catch bus to Manali. We experienced friendly nature of a Delhi rickshaw wala. He was polite, friendly and voluntarily showed all important places on the way and narrated them more than a tourist guide. Thanks to rickshaw wala.

From Delhi, we took a bus to Manali. On the way, bus has stopped (It is 384.2 km away from Manali.) for dinner at 'Kurkshethra'. We were thrilled to hear the name itself.

Moreover, having a roti and cup of coffee on the soil of Kurukshethra, where the great Mahabaratha war was fought, is matter of proud for us. As we moved on serpentine road, we witnessed on either side of the road vista of sylvan, and glimpses of the white sheep grazing on the shelter of sky scraping mountains, deep dells, soothed our eyes and heart. The white snow covered sky scraping mountains, in between swinging clouds, waah... a supernatural beauty was in realization before us. Thank God for his creativity.

We reached Manali by 6 am, checked into the hotel Astha Cottage, which is on the mountain top. Around the hotel there was breath taking views of snow covered mountains, we felt as if we were in haven. For dinner we went to the Mall Road. We enjoyed the chilling weather, with delicious dinner.

We were delighted when we visited Solang Valley' the next morning, where we had pleasant experience of walking through snow covered hills. We also took a small photo break near Beas River and the famous Solang Valley Bridge. On the way to valley, on both side of the road there were shops dealing in special clothing, shoes, sticks on rental base. It was fun to us to wear these dresses.









More over one can't move on the snow fields without these special dresses. In Solang valley amenities are available for adventures activity like skiing, paragliding, etc.

We visited Hidimba Temple situated under the shadow of great Himalayan mountains, surrounded by a cedar forest called Dhungiri Van Vihar. It was about to sun set, when we entered the temple, due to lack of light inside, the gloom of darkness, the low light form burning holy lamp, and a shining image representing goddess Hidimba Devi, has created mysterious divine feeling.

The structure of the temple has four-tiered pagoda-shaped roof, and a carved doorway that is embellished with figures of Hindu gods and symbols.


This wood and stone temple is dedicated to Hadimba, the wife of Bhīma, one of the Pandava brothers of the Mahabharata. It was constructed around 1553, and is located in the middle of the Dhungri Park. In walkable distance, there is a shrine dedicated to the 'Ghatotkach', the son of Bhīma and Hidimba.

Later we visited to Tibetan Monastery near Mall Road. Tibetan Monastery is one of the oldest and famous places in Manali. Due to huge number of Tibetan population settled in Kullu & Manali area, Tibetan Monasteries has been set up. Tibetan Monasteries are one of the popular sightseeing places in Manali. Then we went for shopping in Mall Road, bought hand bag and jackets and later had yummy dinner and headed back to the hotel.

The next day it was snowing heavily and nature looked heavenly beautiful. All the roads were blocked due to heavy snow fall so we couldn't move out. We enjoyed our day at hotel by playing in the fresh snow and relaxing. Finally, by 5.15 pm we checked out the hotel, and we were in a hurry to catch the bus back to Delhi. 




BEAUTIFUL MANALI


PACK THE BAGS AND GO.



French food is known around the world for its finesse and flavor. French cuisine is so highly regarded around the world that in 2010 UNESCO added it to its list of intangible cultural heritage. In France, there are many traditional dishes, some of which you might know as they are popular all over the world. For many, French food is wine and cheese! Well no wonder why it's so famous! But there's a whole world of French cuisine beyond the cheeseboard and wine glasses.

Today's dish is *Flamiche* means 'cake' and this dish originates from Picardy, northern France near the border with Belgium. Traditionally made with a pastry crust filled with cheese and vegetables and resembles a quiche. Try this if you visit France.

Crème au Caramel

My favorite dessert from the land of French is *Creme au Carmael* is a custard dessert with a layer of clear caramel sauce. Preparation is very simple, where sugar syrup cooked to caramel stage is poured into the mold before adding the custard base.

It is usually cooked in a bain-marie on a stovetop or in the oven in a water bath. Later can also be served with the caramel sauce on top. Today crème caramel occupied an excessively large amount of territory in European restaurant dessert menus.
